## Plus: Allen's Anecdotes from Day 1

Today is our first day in Comayagua, a city of about 180,000, but today was mostly about getting here. I think my goal for today was seeing how much Spanish I can pick up. We had a nice lunch of Honduran food including fried plantains. Although we got plantain chips earlier from a street vendor, now that was really good.

In the afternoon we went up into the mountains a little bit to Tintel. This is a focus of the Steer's ministry here. It is a very poor, small, tight-knit community. They are



very closed to outsiders, so the Steer's have started a soccer club. Through this, they give the kids something productive to do and shows them that someone cares about them. They also teach the kids Bible lessons.

Gradually, the hope is to build friendships with the adults in the community and create change. There is a lot of alcoholism and violence against women and they hope to change that. We will be involved in one of the first steps in that direction as we help build ovens for several families later this week. For now, pray that we will be a part of building relationships in the community and the people will be open to us.
