

Small Group Questions
Jesus is the I AM – Mark 14:53-65

1. What stood out to you, challenged you, or encouraged you from the sermon Sunday?
2. 1 Peter 2:22-23 tells us why Jesus didn't answer or retaliate when falsely accused. Discuss a time in your life when you were falsely accused of something.
3. How easy or hard is it for you to stay silent when people accuse you of things that aren't true? How easy or hard is it for you to let God take care of those situations? In what situations would it be appropriate or even necessary to speak up?
4. Jesus is blameless. He was tempted, but He never sinned. What comfort does that give you? (See Hebrews 2:18 and Hebrews 4:15-16)
5. Jesus is God, the I AM. (Exodus 3:14-15 - The God who always has been, is right now and always will be.) He is the Messiah, prophesied about in the Old Testament. (Psalm 110:1, Daniel 7:13-14) Does seeing Jesus as both God and the Messiah encourage you in any way?
6. How do you think you're doing as a living testimony to who Jesus is?
7. What experience from your life would give testimony to who you believe Jesus is?
8. Read Ephesians 4:1-3. Which of these instructions is most difficult for you to live out?
9. Read Ephesians 4:17-32. What else do these verses say about how we are to live as Christians?
10. How should Romans 8:1, 31-39 encourage us in regards to how we live our lives?
