Small Group Questions

Legacy – Passing it on the Next Generation 5.10.15

Read Psalm 78 (The Whole Psalm)

- What was your takeaway from the message Sunday about passing on truths to the next generation?
- What responsibility do we as God's people have to the generations that come after us?
- Parents, what does it look like for you to teach your children "the glorious deeds of the LORD" (v.4)?
- If you do not have children, what does it look like to play a part in helping tell of God's deeds to the next generation?
- In the wilderness, Israel doubted (v.20), forgot (v.11), and rejected God (vv.56-57). In what ways- whether large or small- are you tempted to do the same?
- Psalm 78 is a wonderful reminder that remembering who God is and what he has done for the church. What truths about God and his works do you need to be reminded of this week? How can other believers assist you in this? Who can you help and how?
- Israel was being called upon to remember and pass on God's great work of deliverance on their behalf. What is God's supreme work of deliverance that we are to pass on today? (See 1 Corinthians 15:3-4)
- What are some ways that the gospel affects our day to day lives? (See 2 Peter 1:3-11)
- In Psalm 78, we see that God is a generous king, a victorious warrior, a righteous judge, a glorious God, an atoning sacrifice, a good shepherd, and a loving father. Which of these attributes resonate with you? Which seem foreign? Why?
